FEELINGS

This will cause them late planning in their estate for their legal and non-legal heirs. The rights of both parties will be infringed due to late planning of estate if the deceased died without leaving any wills (Wasiyyah) or Hibah to the beneficiaries as the estate might fall to the other person's hands. Thus, it described the importance of the conducting of the SULAM project in the community.



EVALUATION AND ANALYSIS
